

2. Launch a Project


To launch a Writer's Universe project, click on your assignment and then click on the book icon in the dialog window that opens. Your genre project homepage will open in a new tab.

Writer's Universe will guide you through the steps in the writing process, from brainstorming through drafting and all the way to publishing your final project!

- About the Genre: Learn about the features of the genre you will be writing.
- **Pre-Write:** Brainstorm your ideas, choose your topic, and plan your writing.
- **Draft:** Write your first draft.
- **Revise/Edit:** Revise your draft with helpful tips.
- **Publish:** Publish your completed genre project.
- **Reflect:** Reflect on your experience and refine your writing skills.

3. Learn About the Genre

You'll begin your genre project by viewing a short video that introduces Writer's Universe.

- Watch the Videos: Once you've viewed the introduction video, click Go to Next Page to watch a video about the genre.
- View Genre Features: Once you've viewed the genre video, click Go to Next Page again to see a summary of the genre features. You can come back to this section throughout the project.
- 3. Read the Mentor Text: After you've read the genre's features, click Go to Next Page to read a Mentor Text. Click the magnifying glasses to highlight each genre feature within the text.
- 4. Complete the Genre Activity: When you've read the Mentor Text, click Go to Next Page to practice your understanding of the genre's features with a short activity. Drag and drop text from the Mentor Text on the left into the boxes on the right. When you've completed the activity, click Check Answers.

As you work, some steps may be locked for your teacher to review. You can choose to leave the project at this point or refresh the page to see if your teacher has had a chance to review and unlock the next step for you!

Your teacher can monitor and comment on your writing throughout the project, and lock or unlock each step along the way.

4. Pre-Write, Locate Writing Tips and Rubric


It's time to begin the pre-write stage! You'll start by brainstorming your ideas.

- Brainstorm Ideas: Use the interactive web to add your ideas. Click Add Idea to add as many ideas as you'd like! Once you've created a few ideas, click Go to Next Page.
- 2. Chose Your Focus: Use the checklist to evaluate your ideas and click the star to choose one! Once you've chosen your idea, click **Go to** Next Page.
- 3. Plan Your Writing: On this page, fill in the chart to plan your writing. Click Go to Next Page once you've completed the chart.

At any time, click on the **Tools** icon on the right to view the rubric and writing tips. The box will slide out.

The **Rubric** tab shows you exactly what content your teacher wants to see in your writing.

The **Tips** tab provides you with a checklist for each step of the writing process—you can check off each tip as you go, which will help you create your strongest draft.

- I. Start Your Draft: Once you've completed pre-writing and are ready to begin writing, click Go to Next Page to start your draft.
- 2. Review Your Plan: Click on the Plan tab anytime to review the previous step. Use this as a guide as you write your draft.
- 3. Submit Your Draft: When your draft is ready for review, click Go to Next Page and it will be submitted to your teacher for review.


6. Take Another Look at Your Project


At any stage during the writing process, your teacher may request that you take another look at the project to make sure it is meeting the rubric requirements.

You'll receive a message from your teacher requesting that you review and edit that step before the project is unlocked and you can continue.

To take another look, open your Writer's Universe project and pick up the project where you left off. The draft number will appear in the top left corner of your project. Remember to check for comments from your teacher in the Comments box!

Once you've made your updates, you can submit the project to your teacher for review. You can also print your draft using the **Print** button.





7. Chat with Your Teacher

To chat with your teacher, select the **Chat** icon, located above Tools. Choose the **Teacher Conference** tab.


You can start a conference with your teacher by selecting **Start New**. Once you've found your teacher, select **Start New Room**.

If you've already begun a chat, your messages will display when you open the Chat box. Click the arrow to view the full chat.

Use the chat to ask your teacher for help. You can click **Share My Writing** to send your teacher a link to your writing.


8. Chat with Your Peers

Your teacher can set up a peer conference with your classmates. A notification will appear in the Chat tab when a peer chat is set up.

Click on the **Peer Conference** tab. All of your peer chats will be listed.

Click the arrow to open the chat. Click **Share My Writing** to send your teacher a link to your writing, or to share your writing with the peers in your chat. Your peers can share writing with you, too! When they do, you can click on the link that is sent in the chat.

To exit the peer conference, click on the red close button. To close the chat area, click on the chat tab.

9. Review Comments

Your teacher or peers may leave comments on your writing during the draft, revise, and edit stages. Comments help you improve your writing. Think about how you can use comments from your teacher and peers to improve your writing between each stage of the writing process.

Click the **Comments** tab on the left side of an open project to view comments. You can respond to comments or leave a new comment here as well.

Even if you do not have your writing project open, you will still be able to see if someone has commented on your writing. You'll receive a new message in your Benchmark Universe Message Center when someone has commented on your project.

Click on the hyperlink inside the message to be transported back into your Writer's Universe project to read the comment!


10. Publish Your Genre Project
